
7. The Bill of Rights


- a. Create a poster, booklet, poster, PowerPoint, or Prezi that describes the rights guaranteed to US citizens by the Bill of Rights. For each item, create a visual and include an explanation of the right.
- b. The Bill of Rights (the first 10 amendments to the Constitution are called the Bill of Rights).
 - i. People have the freedom of religion, speech and press, the right to assemble, and the right to petition the government.
 - ii. People have the right to keep and bear arms.
 - iii. People cannot be forced to keep soldiers in their homes.
 - iv. No official can arrest or search a person or his home without legal warrant from a judge.
 - v. No one can be tried for a capital crime unless accused by a grand jury. No one can be forced to testify against him or herself. No one can be punished without due process of law. People must be paid for property taken for public use.
 - vi. People have the right to a speedy trial, to legal counsel, and to confront their accusers.
 - vii. People have the right to a jury trial in civil suits exceeding twenty dollars.
 - viii. Excessive bails and fines are not permitted. Cruel and unusual punishments are not allowed.

- ix. People have other rights in addition to those rights listed in the Constitution.
- x. Powers not given to the federal government belong to the states or the people.

8. <u>Community Service</u>

- a. Choose and complete ONE community service project. Fill out and turn in the form (Attachment D) and listed requirements.
- b. Choices...
 - i. Help out (clean up or set up) for a charitable event or a PTA project or event (include 3 pictures).
 - ii. Write a letter to a member of the armed forces, a charity, etc. showing your support (provide a copy of your letter).
 - iii. Visit a nursing home, hospital or shut in (include 3 pictures).
 - iv. Help someone in your community that is ill or elderly (mow grass, deliver groceries, put out their trash, shovel snow, etc.). You may NOT receive money for doing this (include 3 pictures).
 - v. Participate with your Youth Group (church, scouts, 4H, etc.) in a service project OR as an individual in a community clean-up project (include 3 pictures).
 - vi. Collect non-perishable foods and clothing for a local food bank, homeless shelter, etc. (include 3 pictures).
